

OMS CLUBS AND ACTIVITIES: 2011-2012

ART CLUB

Art club is designed for students who want to challenge themselves with interesting and creative projects. From drawing and painting, to crafts and sculpture, it will be a fun year in the Art Club!

BEST BUDDIES

Best Buddies is an international friendship organization that pairs up students with and without a disability into a one-to-one friendship called a “buddy match.” Students who join this club will participate in fun group activities that are planned by the students and advisors two times per month. The purpose of Best Buddies is to ensure that everyone has the opportunity to have a friend.

DRAMA CLUB— (2012 Theater Production of ‘Oliver’)

Members of the Drama Club perform a full-scale musical each year. Students must audition to be part of the on-stage cast, and must be available for every rehearsal (students involved in Winter I or II sports will not be eligible for membership in the Drama Club). For students who prefer to work behind the scenes, there are opportunities for set and costume design, backstage crew, and publicity work.

MULTICULTURAL CLUB

This club provides a social opportunity for ESL students to become better acquainted with other OMS students, as well as to increase awareness of the student body cultural diversity. Activities include learning about cultural customs, creating crafts, cooking ethnic foods, and learning ethnic dances. All these activities culminate with the district-wide Multicultural Festival, where club members perform the dances and songs they’ve learned during club meetings.

SCIENCE RESEARCH CLUB

Do you enjoy building things? Do you find yourself always wondering how something works? Do you always want to know more than your science teacher tells you? The Science Research Club will show you how to build your own machines such as robots and guides you to dig deeper and answer those science questions that you might have.

SCHOOL STORE

Through an application process, faculty members select students to work at the Store (during lunch periods). Students must possess those qualities which enable them to work with other students and adults, compute prices, listen to and complete a list of a shopper’s desired items, manage a cash register, and attend his/her shift. With some experience, students can record out-of-stock items and order new merchandise for the Store. Staff and students purchase items at the School Store during Homeroom and lunch periods.

STUDENT RECOGNITION CLUB

This club is designed to recognize and honor students who have exhibited positive character traits. Each month of the school year is assigned a specific trait. Teams of teachers nominate students who exhibit the current month’s character trait. A group of student committee members then meet each month to generate ‘goodie’ bags for the nominated students and decorate the hallways with quotes that promote the new month’s character traits.

YEARBOOK (7th& 8th Grade)

Club activities include creating posters and advertisements for Yearbook sales; creating collages for the photo spreads in the Yearbook; taking candid pictures; promoting the “Design the Yearbook Cover” contest; and aiding in the general layouts of the Yearbook format.
