Alfred University – Lelia E. Tupper Writing Scholarship

\$1,000 will be awarded for each of four years at Alfred University. Manuscripts must be submitted in both of the following categories: creative writing and expository writing. The portfolio must be postmarked by January 31, 2012. Please visit alfred.edu/finaid/scholarships for further information.

American Heritage Scholarship

The Island Christian Church will be awarding two \$1,500 scholarships to Long Island students whose lives exemplify genuine character and promote Scriptural values upon which our country was founded. Up to four \$500 High Honorable Mention scholarships may also be awarded. Selection of the winners will be based upon an essay written by the applicant as well as three recommendations. All required nominations and recommendations must be received by March 9, 2012. The application is available online at www.ichristianc.org.

Association of Fire Districts

Four Ned Carter Scholarships will be awarded to students who are related to or are firefighters in an affiliated member organization of the Association of Fire Districts of the State of New York and who reside within NYS. Applications may be found at www.firedistnys.com. The application can be completed online, printed and mailed as directed. Applications must be postmarked by the first Saturday in March.

Drew University

Civic Engagement Scholarships – These scholarships in the amount of \$20,000 (\$5,000 per year for four years) are offered to students who have demonstrated a sustained commitment to community service during their high school years. Applicants should demonstrate leadership in organizing and implementing community projects. They should also have the ability to work well with people from diverse backgrounds. Deadline is February 1, 2012.

Presidential Scholarship in the Arts – These scholarships in the amount of \$20,000 (\$5,000 per year for four years) are offered to students who have demonstrated exceptional talent in art, music, creative writing, or theater. Scholarship recipients do not have to major in an artistic field but they must continue to remain active in the arts to maintain this scholarship. As part of the application process, students must submit samples of their work. Deadline is February 1, 2012.

RISE Science Scholarships – These scholarships in the amount of \$20,000 (\$5,000 per year for four years) are offered to students who have excelled academically and wish to major in biochemistry and molecular biology, biology, chemistry, computer science, engineering, environmental studies and sustainability, mathematics, neuroscience or physics. Fairleigh Dickinson University

The Metropolitan Scholar Award is a full-tuition scholarship program for high-achieving students. The award may be renewed annually over the course of four years of study at FDU's Metropolitan campus in Teaneck, New Jersey. To qualify, students must have a cumulative GPA of 3.5 or higher; rank in the top 10% of their class; have a minimum SAT score of 1300 (math plus critical reading), and apply as residential students at FDU's Metropolitan campus. Interested students must notify their guidance counselors that they wish to be considered for nomination. Up to three (3) students may be nominated per high school. Five Towns College

Students who wish to earn a Bachelor of Science degree in Childhood Education at Five Towns College may submit their name for nomination. This is a 50% tuition scholarship for 4 years. Students should have a minimum GPA of 80% and a 1300 SAT score. Please see Mrs. Sales for additional information.

The program is offered to academically exceptional students from traditionally underrepresented populations who have demonstrated strong character and leadership through service and community involvement. Scholars receive a minimum award of \$25,000. In addition to meeting regular admission requirements and deadlines, interested students must submit a separate scholarship application, essays and recommendation by January 15th.
